A summary of which appears below:

Acceptance of sections 3 to 7, inclusive, of Chapter 44B of the General Laws, would be pursuant to Section 3(h) of Chapter 44B of the General Laws. Sections 3 to 7 of Chapter 44B of the General Laws of Massachusetts, also known as the Community Preservation Act, (hereinafter “the Act”) establish a dedicated funding source to enable cities and towns to (1) acquire, create and preserve open space, which includes land for parks, recreational uses, conservation areas and the protection of drinking water supplies, and rehabilitate local parks, playgrounds, and athletic fields; (2) acquire, preserve, rehabilitate and restore historic buildings and resources; and (3) create and preserve affordable housing.

In Danvers, the funding source for these community preservation purposes will be a surcharge of 1.0% on the annual property tax assessed on real property beginning in the next fiscal year following the election, and by annual distributions made by the state from a trust fund created by the Act. Only communities that adopt the Act receive a distribution from this state trust fund. A taxpayer receiving a regular property tax abatement or exemption will also receive a pro rata reduction in surcharge.

Upon acceptance by the voters, a Community Preservation Committee will be established by Town by-law, composed of local citizens, to study community preservation resources, possibilities and needs, and to make annual recommendations to Town Meeting on the use of the funds. All expenditures must be approved by Town Meeting.
